Feedback Report: College Feedback Analysis for the Year 2020-21

Introduction:

The college conducted an extensive feedback analysis for the academic year 2020-21, encompassing various stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, parents, and employers. This report focuses on the feedback provided by the students through a structured questionnaire, with 1,054 students participating in the process.

Student Participation:

The feedback process saw active participation from students across different classes. Notably, an overwhelming majority of students actively engaged in providing feedback, with participation rates ranging from 75% to 96.39% across various courses. The highest participation rate was observed in S. Y. B. Com, with 96.39% of students sharing valuable feedback.

Overall Feedback:

The students' feedback predominantly highlighted positive aspects of the college experience. Students appreciated the college's initiatives for quality enhancement and actively participated in college programs and events. Additionally, they made constructive suggestions, such as extending library reading room hours during exam periods, introducing new add-on and value-added courses, and enhancing students' employable skills.

Specific Feedback:

Students were asked a series of questions covering various aspects of their academic journey. The questions covered curriculum evaluation, internal assessment, library facilities, student-teacher relationships, administrative services, extracurricular activities, and alums sentiment.

Key Findings:

Curriculum and Learning Experience:

Students expressed satisfaction with the learning values, course content, and project relevance.

They suggested enhancing the internal assessment system and increasing class syllabus coverage.

Infrastructure and Support Services:

Students appreciated the library holdings but recommended improvements in the availability of prescribed readings.

They were content with the administrative office services but indicated room for improvement in healthcare facilities.

Student-Teacher Relationship:

Students rated the student-teacher relationship positively in both the college as a whole and within their respective departments.

Teachers' attitudes towards extracurricular activities were generally well-received by students.

Extracurricular Activities:

Many students participated in extracurricular activities, reflecting a vibrant campus life.


Alumni Sentiment:
